A dynamic, well-organized, passionate person experienced in youth education and all aspects of theatrical production to serve as Program Coordinator for our highly regarded Summer Youth Theatre Program. The Summer Youth Theatre Program operates for 8 weeks during the months of July and August: daily onsite supervision of youth and staff is a required aspect of this.

The Theatre Technician will work within the construct of a four-session theatre education summer program alongside the Stage Directors and Assistant Directors to plan, prepare for, create, and organize the sets, sound, costumes, props, lighting, effects and other technical details of our summer theatre education program, which operates over four two-week sessions. The Theatre Technician will work with other staff and enrolled participants, engaging in theatrical activities and educational experience that inspire and develop latent technical skills in the youth participants. The Stage Technician will ensure the safety, security and occupation of participants at all times. Additionally, the Theatre Technician will ensure that all participants and guardians conform to current and healthy safety guidelines while on site. They will work together with the Director of Education, Program Director, and General Manager with regards to the usage of any theatre-owned equipment and materials.

Qualifications

This job is part of the Canada Summer Jobs Program. As per the requirements of the program, candidates need to meet the following criteria. Please ensure you review the below before applying:

- Be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment;
- Have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations;
- The candidate must be 15 years of age at the beginning of the employment period. The candidate may be older than 30 years of age by the end of the employment period, but must not be older than 30 years of age at the beginning of the employment period;

- Youth awaiting a refugee status ruling, as well as those who hold any form of a temporary visa, which may entitle them to work, are ineligible to apply under the terms of the Canada Summer Jobs program.
